Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) is a scheme that fosters cross-year support between students on the same course.

PAL encourages students to support each other and to learn collaboratively under the guidance of trained students, called PAL Leaders, from the year above.

PAL sessions are:

- 1 hour long, usually timetabled weekly
- student-to-student facilitated learning
- in an informal environment for relaxed discussions

Peer assisted learning/SI/PASS schemes operate **in law** in a number of institutions:

- Bournemouth University
- Canterbury Christ University
- Teesside University
- University of Bradford
- University of Bristol
- University of Exeter
- University of Kent
- University of Plymouth
- University of the West of England
- Galway Mayo Institute of Technology
- National University of Ireland Galway
- Nord University
- University of Edinburgh

Typically these universities will operate PAL in difficult 1st year law modules, rather than in later year electives such as IP law

HOW DID PAL WORK IN AN UNDERGRADUATE IP MODULE




The IP module at the University of Reading: Is taught in the final year of the LLB.

- Covers Copyright, Patent, Breach of Confidence/Privacy, Trade Mark and Passing off
- Currently has 150 students
- Involves 30 hours of lectures and 5 × 1.5 hour interactive small-group workshops
- Is assessed by a 100% exam
 - The IP module led our law school in trialling PAL in law in 2015

WHAT DID MY LEADERS DO IN THE PAL SESSIONS?

- Discuss and revise topics taught in lectures and workshops
- Facilitate and guide students in answering IP questions and resolving IP disputes
- Develop students' problem solving skills





WHAT WERE THE BENEFITS OF PAL FOR MY STUDENTS?

For the PAL student participants:

- Better results grades in IP for PAL participants were better than the cohort average
 - This impact on grades has also been replicated in other PAL modules in law and across the University
- Better engagement with the core IP curriculum I was teaching



WHAT WERE THE BENEFITS OF PAL FOR MY STUDENTS?

"If you feel that you don't know something, and there's a lecturer in the room, you're less inclined to ask the lecturer a question because even if the lecture is the nicest person in the world, you feel "oh, my god, they're going to know that I don't know anything".

Whereas here [in PAL], you [Fern, the PAL leader] are a student, you've been through this, you know exactly what we're going through. And so we kind of feel lot closer to you [Fern] and more inclined to kind of find out what we're doing wrong. That helps."

WHAT WERE THE BENEFITS OF PAL Reading FOR MY STUDENTS?

For the PAL leaders:

- PAL leader training described as highly beneficial it helped develop confidence and skills
- PAL leaders developed expertise leading a classroom
- Developed a better understanding of the IP topics by facilitating student learning.
- While the Reading PAL scheme prohibits payments to the students, I did sneak them each Amazon gift cards as a thank you.



WHAT WERE THE BENEFITS OF PAL Reading FOR ME?

For me as a lecturer:

- PAL leaders let me know about common areas of confusion in the module which I could then resolve for the whole cohort
- My students obtained better understanding of the subject and better results
- I was able to mentor the PAL IP leaders, who are each now giving active consideration to IP PhD topics and academia as a profession.



CONSIDERING PAL FOR YOUR OWN Reading

Common questions I am asked by colleagues:

- What central university resources might be needed to support a PAL scheme?
- What is the time commitment for the IP lecturer/module convenor?
- How to recruit PAL leaders (particularly for final year modules where your institution does provide LLM programmes in IP)?
- Is this unfairly exploiting unpaid student labour?
